# Word Study: October 30<sup>th</sup> – Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup>

## Skill Focus

Vowel-consonant-e rule: When a vowel is followed by a consonant and e, the vowel makes its long sound and the e is silent.

Vowel team ue: comes at the end of a syllable

Vowel team ew: comes at the end of a syllable



Suffix -ing is used for verbs that are present tense.

When added -ing to a word that ends in vowel-consonant-e, drop the e and add -ing.
