SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

Pick Elementary School, and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) (participating children), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

School Responsibilities:

Pick Elementary School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

Pick Elementary school has a highly qualified faculty. The teachers use research-based curriculum and instruction and participate in on-going professional development. Instruction and learning targets are aligned to the Alabama Course of Study Standards. Teachers at Pick have also participated in the Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI). Teachers use sound, scientifically research-based instructional practices to teach reading. We use the Benchmark Reading Curriculum as one guide, but this is not the only resource we use to teach reading. Many teachers also use inquiry-based methods to teach Math and Science. As a school system, we have adopted the series Envision Math, Kindergarten-grade 8. Changes in state and national assessments call for more rigor and relevance to children's reading, math, and science programs; therefore, students are required to not only answer questions, but also provide written proof for how they arrived at their answer. We use the STEMscopes curriculum K-5 as a resource for science. We also use science notebooking, hands-on kits, and project-based learning to teach Math, Science, and Social Studies. Pick Elementary ensures that students have a safe and orderly school environment, as well as a warm and friendly school climate.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Pick Elementary School will provide parent conference opportunities and information sessions at the beginning of the year: on Curriculum Night in August and during Parent Teacher Conferences in October. Parents and teachers may request additional conferences throughout the year.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their child(ren)'s progress:

Specifically, Pick Elementary will provide reports and follows:

- Quarterly report cards and progress reports
