






Math - SAVVAS and Other Resources

- O SAVVAS is our math curriculum. Students will be able to access the online homework at home through their Clever page. Students will be given time in class each week to work on homework.
- O Study guides will be provided before each test. All homework is due on study guide day. Homework is graded for accuracy.
- Workbook pages and additional practice pages are placed in students' binders at the beginning of each topic. They are to be used as a reference and as extra practice. They are not graded assignments.







Science - Daily Routine

- O Students will come in each day to a Bell Ringer question. We will hold a classroom discussion about the Bell Ringer question, and a quiz will be given over the previously discussed bell ringers approximately every two weeks.
- Our classes will include a variety of lessons, including whole group, small group, and individual activities. Some of these activities include labs, projects, videos, notes, vocabulary, class discussions, review/games, tests, and quizzes.

- Most science work will be done in class. It is very important that they keep up with daily notes, assignments, and data!

Current Events, now called Elective Survey, will help students understand what is happening in the world while delivering the news in an ageappropriate manner.


They will be required to read or watch a news story of their choosing for homework and share their findings with the class.





Lions / DMS Procedures

- Procedures: Letters with LIONS team procedures were sent home when school started. Also, you can refer to the student handbook for a complete explanation of school policies and procedures.
- Colors: Teal, Purple, and Gray
- **T-Shirts**: Lions team specific long sleeve shirts will be sold in the fall. **Wear Lions shirts every Thursday** ©
- Academics/Zeros: Please check the Parent Portal weekly to see what your child is missing. Don't wait until the end of the 9 weeks to inquire about grades. (Parent portal will be available very soon.)
 - Missing Work: 1's in the grade book indicate a student can still submit work for credit; 0's in the grade book mean work will no longer be accepted for credit. (See student handbook for further explanation.)
- Mid-term Reports and Report Cards: These are sent home each 9 weeks.
- Capturing Kids Hearts (CKH) Purpose, 3 Hand Signals, and Social Contracts
- Discipline:
 - → PBS school-wide discipline plan which includes an online reward system and a place for students to purchase rewards with the money earned.
 - Discipline Points 100 points each semester
 - ★ Follow DMS/ACS rules in student planner

ID Badges

- O ID badges must be worn by all students and faculty at DMS.
- O Students will use the ID Badge for access to the different buildings.
- The ID Badge will be utilized to purchase breakfast / lunch in the cafeteria and for checking out books in the Media Center.



ID Badge Important Information

Students will be issued a J. F. Drake Middle School Identification Badge and lanyard as a feature of our safety plan. Students will be required to properly wear this form of identification around their neck throughout the entire school day.

Damaged, lost, or badges that have been altered in any way will result in students having to purchase a new badge for \$5.00.

Disciplinary consequences for students not having their Identification Badge are as follows:

- 1st Offense warning and temporary badge issued
- 2nd Offense student serves one (1) day of silent lunch
- O 3rd Offense student serves two (2) days of silent lunch and administrative conference
- 4th Offense student serves one (1) day in after-school detention
- 5th Offense and subsequent offenses student serves two (2) days of after-school detention up to an ISS Placement.

Medication

- O You must have medical forms on file with the nurse for ANY medication Ibuprofen, Tylenol, etc. should not be kept in purses, backpacks, etc.
- Cell phones
 - OTurned OFF not to be seen, heard, or used between 7:50-3:30
 - If seen or heard, student will be warned and parent contacted.
 - O If they are in use (text/call/video/etc.) they will be taken according to policy.
 - 01st time we keep it 24 hours and a parent picks it up
 - O2nd time we keep it 10 days and a parent picks it up
 - O3rd time we keep it till the end of the semester and a parent picks it up

Ipad Use and Expectations

O iPad Usage

- Each student received an iPad for school use.
- ODMS students will not take iPads home. Students will leave iPads with homeroom teacher every afternoon and pick them up each morning.
- O iPads are for **instructional use** only.
- O Students who do not use their iPad appropriately will receive consequences.
 - O1st offense Warning and Parent contact
 - O2nd offense One (1) day of silent lunch
 - O3rd offense Two (2) days of silent lunch and administrative conference
 - O4th offense One (1) day of after school detention
 - ○5th offense Student loses iPad access for remainder of semester.

Technology Tutorial

- O <u>Schoology</u> our learning management platform
 - This is what you will use if you enter a remote learning mode at any point during the year.
 - Know your child's password to Schoology!
- O Envision this is our online math textbook
- O Office 365 your child has a school-based email address and access to cloud storage, composition, and sharing with teachers
- O PowerSchool this is our new (statewide) information system and grading platform
 - Allow time for entering of grades
 - O Teach children to self-advocate and discuss grades with teachers
 - O Parent Portal Letter went home last week with information for parent login access

DMS / PBIS Discipline Procedures

- PBIS Rewards are part of our school-wide PBS (Positive Behavior Support) discipline program. -Rewards are awarded each week to students, mainly during homeroom, but may still be earned from ANY class up to the teacher's discretion.
- O Rewards can be earned by doing the following in homeroom:
 - If the student has not received any silent lunches and detentions/referrals/ISS/suspensions that week
 - If the student wears his/her team T-shirt on established days (Thursdays)
 - ☆ Discipline Points 100 points each semester
 - ★ Follow Team/DMS procedures
 - ★ Teacher classroom procedures




Follow ACS policy (<u>www.auburnschools.org/Page/5968</u>) - consistency is our goal and is a PRIMARY focus for us as we start 2023-2024 school year. Just because it was allowed last year – this year will be different!

Typical issues at DMS:

- Shorts that are above 5 inches from the bottom of the torso
- Pants with holes rips or tears must be below 5" from end of torso unless concealed by material beneath holes
- Tops must overlap with pants/bottoms to conceal abdomen/waist including during activity
- Pants must be worn at the waist
- When in doubt, don't wear it!
- Teach your child about the difference in school clothes and weekend clothes.
- Extra clothes are an excellent idea for many reasons!
- Parents/ guardians WILL be called to bring clothes if your child is out of dress code. Students will be sent to ISS to sit until clothes arrive. Repeat offenders will earn disciplinary consequences.


Discipline Points Breakdown

- O Silent lunches will be given when our social contract is broken or classroom expectations are not met. We typically give warnings and reminders before we give a silent lunch, so silent lunches are a last resort for us.
- O Students will have to complete a reflection form that informs their parents of their silent lunch. Students are to return the form signed by a parent the next day.
- Each 9 weeks, silent lunches start over. Discipline points start over each semester.

Students will lose discipline points when the following consequences are incurred.


