Student Identification Badges

DMS/PBS Discipline Procedures

Discipline:

☆Discipline Points- 100 points each semester

PBIS bucks are part of our school-wide PBS (Positive Behavior Support) discipline program. PBIS. Bucks are awarded each week to students, mainly during homeroom, but may still be earned from ANY class up to the teacher's discretion. PBIS \$ can be earned by doing the following in homeroom:

- \$15 if the student has not received any silent lunches and detentions/referrals/ISS/suspensions that week
- \$10 if the student wears his/her team T-shirt on established days

PBIS Store – Students can cash in \$ for prizes, candy, etc.

Silent Lunch/Working Lunch Silent Lunch

- Silent Lunch is earned for making poor decisions. Silent lunch is a last resort and warnings have already been given.
- Silent Lunch takes place in a classroom near the cafeteria. Students will eat silently and fill out a reflection paper to take home to be signed.

Working Lunch

- When students choose not to complete homework or class work assignments, they will earn a working lunch.
- Complete assignment during lunch silently
- Full Credit may not be given.

Advisory – Every Wednesday

- Student advisory is a program designed to ensure that every student at J.F. Drake Middle School is known by and feels comfortable talking to at least one faculty member about academic, social, or personal topics.
- Research shows that students transition through this developmental stage more smoothly when they are supported and guided by an adult.



- Sharing and listening


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
 Homework will be given only if classwork is not completed. It is due by the assigned date (typically the next school day) in order to receive full credit.




