# ART with Mrs. Basgier





- \*Be sure to *put all of your items away* where you found them when you're finished.
- \*\*For an added challenge, make themed Color Wheels (Food items, toys, household décor)
- \*\*\*For a SUPER added challenge, add the Intermediate colors to your Color Wheel! (red-orange, red-violet, blue-green, blue-violet, yellow-orange, & yellow-green)

# Art Made from Nature Challenge

- 1. <u>Go outside</u> and gather naturally occurring items from your yard or neighborhood-sticks, leaves, rocks, or anything else of interest you might find. Please make sure not to pick things that still need to grow-like flowers or food-without asking permission first!
