I hope you're all happy and **HEALTHY**. If you're looking for ways to **be CREATIVE** I have some ideas to share...

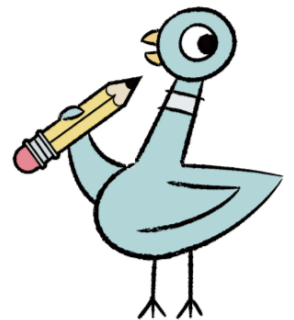

Household Color Wheel Challenge

1. Gather items from around your house in each of the following colors: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, violet.
(Roy G. Biv)
2. Lay your items out in a circle to create a color wheel; be sure to follow the correct color order!



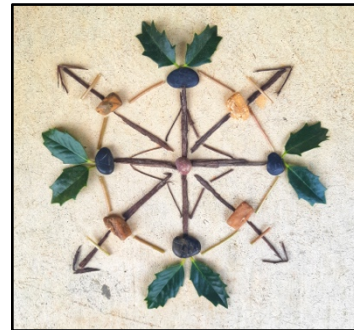
**Be sure to put all of your items away where you found them when you're finished.*

***For an added challenge, make themed Color Wheels (Food items, toys, household décor)*

****For a SUPER added challenge, add the Intermediate colors to your Color Wheel!
(red-orange, red-violet, blue-green, blue-violet, yellow-orange, & yellow-green)*

Art Made from Nature Challenge

1. **Go outside** and gather naturally occurring items from your yard or neighborhood—sticks, leaves, rocks, or anything else of interest you might find. *Please make sure not to pick things that still need to grow—like flowers or food—without asking permission first!*
2. Make a picture with your items. You can lay these out wherever you have the space: in the dirt, on the grass, on a sidewalk! Your artwork can be a pattern or design —OR— you can turn your items into something recognizable. It's up to you!
