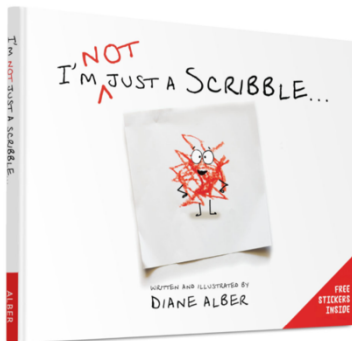
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## Supplies Needed

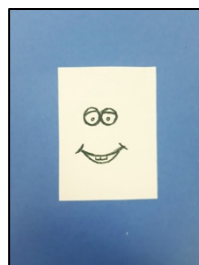
### Step 1

Pick a few different colors of crayons and create a scribble in the middle of your page.



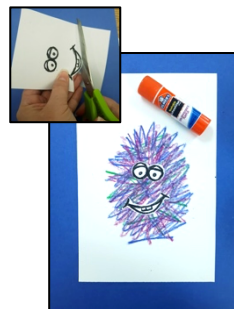
### Step 2

Carefully cut out your eyes and mouth. Using a glue stick, attach them to your scribble.



### Step 4

Draw arms, hands, legs, and feet to finish your scribble creature. Give it a silly name if you like!
