

Sight Word Activities

Use the sight word list given to you by your teacher to complete these activities. Pick one a day; either repeat your favorite activities or pick a new one each day! For some activities, you need to write the words on cards first.

Pick 10 words and put them in ABC order.	Rainbow Write! Write your words using many different colors.	Choose a word. Look at it for 10 seconds, turn it over, and see if you can spell it.
Pick 10 words and sort them by number of letters in each word.	Choose a word. See how many times you can find it in a book or magazine.	Practice writing words in shaving cream, paint, play dough, or pudding.
Cheer the words like a cheerleader. (Give me a "s-e-e", what does that spell? SEE!)	Pick the opposite hand you usually write with and try to write words.	Write words with the consonants one color and the vowels another color.
Write a sight word on someone's back and see if s/he can figure out what the word is.	Write sentences with the words. Don't forget your capital letter, finger spaces, and punctuation!	Come up with your own way to practice. Let us know your idea!
