Little Fires Everywhere, Celeste Ng (2017) Realistic fiction about a cookie cutter suburban community and the new neighbors.

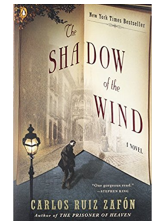
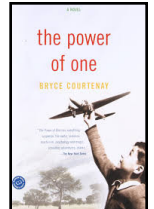
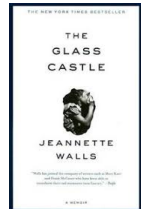
The Midnight Fox, Betsy Byars (1981) Classic children's story about a city boy who has to spend a summer in the country.
