BUS Information

- Routes will be posted in the schools around late July/ early August
 - Wait at the nearest bus stop to your house on the first day of school.
- Students must know their bus numbers and the bus waves.
 - Tip: write both numbers in the designated area of the planner
- Changing of transportation
 - Call the front office only if the message needs to get to your student regarding a change (call before 3pm)
 - Students must have a signed "Change of Transportation" form in order to ride a bus they are assigned. They will not be allowed on the bus without the form.

DRESS FOR SUCCESS

- Consistency is our goal!
- When in doubt, don't wear it!
 - Extra clothes in lockers are beneficial
- Parents/guardians will be contacted to bring clothes.

- Typical issues and concerns
 - Shorts that are above the 4-inches above the knee
 - Pants with holes that do not meet the 4-inch rule unless there is material beneath the holes.
 - Leggings
 - Worn with an acceptable top that covers the private areas of the body.
 - Shorts that are too revealing
 - Pants must be worn at the waist





DISCIPLINE AND DISCIPLINE POINTS

SCHOOL

- Our goal is to be fair, consistent, and developmentally appropriate
- Teaching moments- We may not call parents/guardian every time.
- Discipline points are deducted for the following:
 - Team detention (10 points)
 - School-wide detention (15 points per day)
 - Bus suspension (25 points per suspension)
 - ISS (70 points per placement)
 - Suspension (25 points per day)
 - Alternative School (200 points)
- You must have points to participate in events and fieldtrips
- Points are reflected as a homeroom grade (not an academic grade)

BASIC SECURITY MEASURES IN PLACE


- Existing drill schedule

TERMINOLOGY TO KNOW



LOCKDOWN DRILL

Conducted in accordance with existing State of Alabama laws. Will be unannounced May occur at transition times Will NOT be communicated to parents/guardians These are drills only, and do not constitute a true emergency situation



SECURE YOUR AREA


Used as a precautionary measure

Will periodically be conducted as a drill

Students and staff who are outside will be brought inside. Normal school activities will proceed, but with limited hallway movement

Parents/guardians will NOT be notified, as this is not a Lockdown, and there is no direct threat to the campus


- Meet Your Teachers
