Rise to Globalism, Stephen E. Ambrose and Douglas G. Brinkley

One of the major themes of this course is looking at the development and increasing globalization of American foreign policy. To investigate this theme, you will read the book *Rise to Globalism* for the first part of your summer work. I have copies of the book for you to check out, and they will need to be returned to me on the first day of school. Please do not write in your book. You will be expected to fill out the corresponding packet as you read the book and turn it in on the first day of school. Also expect to take a test on the *first full day of class* on the content of the book.

American Independence Movements

Although much of the focus for IB History 11 is on American history, the full course covers history of the Americas. The formation of American countries as independent nations is essential to understanding this history and is a major topic for the IB Exam, Paper 3. You will be assigned an American country (not including the United States) and investigate the independence movement for that country. There are two parts to this assignment. Both parts will be due *the day you return to school*.

Part A: Visual

You will create a visual representation for your assigned country that includes basic information about that nation and its independence movement. You should use a half-poster board. Be prepared to present.

Requirements:

- Name of country
- Current government type
- Dominant language and religion
- Year of independence and country from which it earned independence
- Map to show location (make it a continent map, not a world map)
- National flag
- Brief background on how that nation earned independence (can use bullet points)
- Three images other than the map and flag (people, places, etc.)

Part B: Paper

You will write a 500-word paper discussing your assigned country's independence movement. Use 12 point, Times New Roman font, double-spaced, and one inch margins. Use Chicago style for citations (see the following page for formatting).

Requirements:

- Correct formatting and word count (see above)
- Works Cited Page in Chicago Style
- Context of independence (i.e. set up the situation prior to this nation gaining independence)
- Reasons for independence movement
- Important people, places, and events
- Changes caused by independence
- Conclusion/significance of independence
