SCHOOL OPERATIONS

- SCHOOL LIBRARIES WILL BE OPEN TO STUDENTS.
- ELEMENTARY STUDENTS WILL TRAVEL TO ART/MUSIC/COMPUTER CLASSROOMS.
- WATER FOUNTAINS WILL BE ACCESSIBLE DURING THE DAY. STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO BRING WATER BOTTLES.

TRADITIONAL SCHOOL OPTION

- THE TRADITIONAL IN-SCHOOL OPTION IS THE ONLY OPTION AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES K-8.

COVID-19 CONTACT TRACING

- PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE NO LONGER RESPONSIBLE FOR CONTACT TRACING DUE TO EXPOSURE TO COVID-19.
- THE ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH WILL NOTIFY ALL CLOSE CONTACTS DIRECTLY AND PROVIDE INSTRUCTIONS RELATED TO QUARANTINE OR ISOLATION.

HANDWASHING

- FREQUENT HANDWASHING WILL BE ENCOURAGED FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF.
- HAND SANITIZER WILL BE AVAILABLE IN SCHOOLS.

VIRTUAL SCHOOL OPTION

- THE VIRTUAL SCHOOL OPTION IS ONLY AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS IN GRADES 9-12.

- PROGRESS MUST BE MAINTAINED IN [ACCESS](#) COURSES TO CONTINUE IN THE VIRTUAL PROGRAM.

MASKS

- MASKS ARE OPTIONAL FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS AT INDOOR ACTIVITIES.

HOME PREPAREDNESS

- THE FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE FOR PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF INFECTION OF ANY ILLNESS IN OUR SCHOOLS IS THE HOME DEFENSE.
- PLEASE KEEP STUDENTS AT HOME IF THERE ARE SYMPTOMS OF INFECTIOUS ILLNESS.

CLEANING

- CUSTODIAL STAFF WILL SANITIZE DOORKNOBS AND HANDLES ROUTINELY WITH ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) REGISTERED DISINFECTANTS.

TRANSPORTATION

- SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION OPERATIONS WILL PROCEED NORMALLY UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTIFIED.
- MASKS ARE REQUIRED ON ALL BUSES.
- HAND SANITATION STATIONS ARE PROVIDED ON ALL BUSES.
- STUDENTS WILL FOLLOW ALL SEATING PROTOCOLS.
- WEATHER PERMITTING, ROOF HATCHES AND WINDOWS WILL BE OPENED TO KEEP FRESH AIR CIRCULATING.

POWERSCHOOLS

- POWERSCHOOLS IS THE NEW STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM, REPLACING INOW.
- STUDENT GRADES WILL BE ACCESSED THROUGH POWERSCHOOLS IN THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR.
