Raptor Technologies

This summer, Auburn City Schools implemented a new piece of technology as an added level of security at all elementary campuses.

Raptor Technologies is a visitor management system that has replaced our previous method of signing guests in and is employed by more than 18,000 K-12 school systems across the country.

All visitors to the school will have their government identification (driver's license) scanned and instantly checked against the NATIONWIDE sexual offender database.

Raptor Technologies allows us to better protect our students, staff and guests while making AEEC more safe and secure. Please stop by to have your driver's license scanned so there will not be a delay when you come to visit or check your child out of school.

When you send money to school, please place the money in an envelope with your child's name, the teacher's name, and the purpose of the money. This helps us to keep track of funds and make sure the money goes to the right place.

Be alert to the presence of head lice!

Head lice cases have increased. An estimated 6 to 12 million infestations occur each year in the United States, most commonly among children ages 3 to 11. Therefore, it is not uncommon for lice to be present in the school setting, where large numbers of children are gathered together. Lice are transmitted by direct and pro-longed head-to-head contact, most often in the community and home settings where prolonged head-to-head contact frequently occurs during activities like sleepovers and camps. Schools often see an increase in the presence of lice approximately 10 to 14 days after school and holiday breaks, when these activities often occur. Prevention begins in the home setting. Therefore, it is important for parents to know how to decrease the spread of lice, identify the presence of lice, and know what steps to take if lice are identified.

Parents should encourage their children not to place their head directly against the head of another person when sleeping or participating in activities. Long hair is best placed in braids or ponytails, especially in young children. Parents should check their child's scalp for signs of head lice every week, especially following sleepovers and camps. Although lice are not found to survive on or be spread by sharing personal objects, it is recommended to teach children not to share personal items, which may increase the risk of methicillin-resistant staff infection (MRSA).

It's important to talk to a healthcare provider to discuss the best treatment approach for your family. Resistance to over-the-counter treatments has been reported. Frequent and repeated use of these products may be harmful. New prescription treatment options that are safe are available. If lice are found, your child should be treated and the school nurse notified so that he/she may be checked for response to treatment. A second treatment may be needed in 7 to 10 days. It is important for the child and all family members to continue to check scalps for 3 weeks after initial treatment.

For questions or additional information, please contact your child's school nurse.

If your child should happen to forget something and you need to drop the item off, we will deliver the item to your child's classroom. Unannounced, drop-in visits will not be allowed in order to protect instructional time and ensure that your child's day is not disrupted.

Please help us to speed up the car rider line by following these tips:

- * Parents need to stay in the car. We will assist students as needed.
- * Avoid getting your child's attention while in the car lane. This confuses the child and may encourage them to dash between or toward cars to reach you.
- * At dismissal, keep in line with the other cars by pulling up to the nearest number in line at poles I through 7.
- * In the morning, we want to unload up to 10 cars at a time. Continue to pull all the way up and close to the sidewalk. Unloading 10 cars at a time ensures that everyone is on time in the morning!
- * In the afternoon, if you wish to buckle your child in, you may pull into the last parking lot to do so.
- * Do not go around a car in the line unless you are directed to do so by an AEEC teacher/staff member.
- * Remember that your child will be getting into and out of the car on the passenger side.

Arrival and Dismissal

Your child's attendance in school is very important. Please be sure your child is on time by being in the classroom <u>before</u> 7:45 AM each day. Our school doors open at 7:15 AM. Instruction begins promptly at 7:45 AM. When a student is tardy, he/she misses important directions, news, school announcements, and the pledge of allegiance. Help your child have a successful school year by being present and on time each day.

Car, Bus, Day Care Van Dismissal – 2:35 PM

Buses and day care vans will load and unload in the circle drive at the front of the school.



Bus schedules are being prepared by our transportation department. Please let your teacher know of your desire for bus transportation at Meet the Teacher on August 7th and we will add your child's name to the bus list. You can check bus arrival times at a table set up in the Tigers Den (multipurpose room/gym) for this purpose.

We encourage parents to supervise their child(ren) at the bus stop in the morning and to meet the bus in the afternoon. If the bus is late, it is best for you to stay at the stop and call the school, rather than driving to the school. We will do our best to communicate late buses—if we are aware the bus will be late.

Car riders will use the Car Line at the rear of the school. <u>The entrance is located at Wrights Mill Road and Loftin</u>. If you wish to walk your child into the building, you must use the Visitors Parking Lot or Parkway Baptist's Lot across the street. You may not drop students off at the front of the building without an escort into the building.



Thank you for your patience during the first days of school as all the students learn their new dismissal routines and the teachers learn the students' names. We strive to have efficient, safe dismissal procedures. Thank you for helping us accomplish this goal!
