#### Counselor's Corner

During the first few months of school, we sent out a survey of our counseling program to parents. One question asked parents and teachers to rank topics they hoped their child would be exposed to throughout the year during guidance. High atop that list was positive peer interactions and solving conflicts peacefully. Conflict resolution is one of the nonnegotiable topics for classroom guidance. It always pops up on teacher and parent needs assessments, so it's a high priority for programming. This month, we will focus on positive peer interactions. We will spend a great deal of time focusing on peaceful problem solving. Students will be encouraged to be "upstanders" whenever they see a situation that may involve safety issues. They are encouraged to stand up for others and report the actions immediately. Unfortunately, there is no quick and easy way to help children master conflict resolution skills. The majority of students will need an adult to hold their hand every step of the way. Students are always welcome to come to my room for help in working through a conflict.
