#### **Notes from the Nurse**

We are off to a great start at school. Please review the steps below (from the Alabama Department of Public Health) to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick, even inside your home

- Maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from others not in your household
- Use cloth face coverings when in public
- Clean and disinfect frequently used items and touched surfaces often

\*Reminder: If your child has been determined to have been in close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID19, they should remain out of school for 14 days since the last known contact.

\*AEEC has a new pickup location for students that are ill. Nurse Haley or Nurse Sanderson will contact you via phone and ask that you remain in your car by the wooden pole with the sign that reads "Parking for Nurse's Clinic Pick Up". It is located between the front teacher parking lot and Tiger's Den. Please refer to the picture below. The nurse will assist your child to your car. At that time, she will request to see your ID and obtain your signature.
