On-campus Arrival Time

Through collaboration with School Resource Officers and our local fire department, it has been decided that no automobile will be permitted to park or idle in the fire lane in front of an Auburn City Schools school building. This ensures that the fire lane is clear for emergency personnel, and that we are creating the safest environment possible. Additionally, automobiles picking up car riders are not permitted to park or idle in the car line **more than thirty**

(30) minutes before dismissal of students for the school day. Guests and parents on campus prior to 30 minutes before dismissal should have a purpose other than picking up a car rider, and would need to park in a designated space, and then check in with the main office.
