What We Are Learning

Read Aloud : Night Tree by Eve Bunting

Comprehension: I can identify the main idea of a text and find textual evidence.

Grammar: I can identify contractions.

Phonics: I can spell words with long e.

Writing: I can write a personal narrative and include a beginning, middle, and ending. I can write in complete sentences.

Math: I can solve addition problems with 2-digits addends using different strategies.

Social Sciences: I can participate in Thanksgiving STEM activities. I will research holiday market items, prepare items, and sell items.

Tips for Success:

Please continue to practice addition and subtraction basic math facts. Also, work on your child's understanding of nonfiction text by asking these questions once they have finished reading informational text.

What is the main topic or main idea?

What are some facts or key details?
