What We Are Learning

Read Aloud : Martin Luther King biographies

Comprehension: I can find key facts.

Grammar: I can use commas.

Phonics: I can spell words with r-controlled vowels.

Writing: I can write an informational story.

Math: I can solve 2-digit subtraction problems using different strategies.

Social Sciences: I can learn about changes. I will conduct an investigation to describe and classify various substances according to physical properties (e.g., milk being a liquid, not clear in color, assuming shape of its container, mixing with water; mineral oil being a liquid, clear in color, taking shape of its container, floating in water; a brick being a solid, not clear in color, rough in texture, not taking the shape of its container, sinking in water).
