What We Are Learning

Read Aloud : Snow Day and Brave Irene

Comprehension: I can compare stories and identify the lesson.

Grammar: I can use plural nouns.

Phonics: I can spell words with r-controlled vowels.

Writing: I can write an opinion story.

Math: I can add and subtract 3-digit numbers., including regrouping ones, tens, and hundreds.

Social Sciences: I can learn about changes. I will conduct an investigation to describe and classify various substances according to physical properties (e.g., milk being a liquid, not clear in color, assuming shape of its container, mixing with water; mineral oil being a liquid, clear in color, taking shape of its container, floating in water; a brick being a solid, not clear in color, rough in texture, not taking the shape of its container, sinking in water).
